How can we connect the Common Core to classroom practice?

- How three different types of lessons that deal with content must be utilized to move students to the higher-level critical thinking and analysis skills that are expected of student performance as related to the Common Core.
- Dozens of research-based instructional strategies that challenge and support students to think critically, engage students in their learning, and ensure high expectations for all learners, including reluctant learners.
